4) Project Goal/ History

Organized in 1973, Devonshire PALS is dedicated to developing character in youth, reducing juvenile crime and creating safer communities. We do this by providing after-school enrichment programs for low-income, at-risk children and teens that build strong, positive relationships between youth and law enforcement officers. Due to the tremendous need for youth programs in the southern section of Northridge, and with a community determined to help, PALS built a new youth center in this underserved neighborhood in 2009. Geographically, we serve LAPD's Devonshire Area or the northwest San Fernando Valley in the boundaries of Council District 12. PALS has proudly served this community for 46 years and the Devonshire Youth Center will celebrate 10 years of service in the fall of 2019.

PALS provides enrichment activities M-TH from the hours of 1:00-6:00 including school holidays and summer vacation. In addition we are open on Friday afternoons with programming specifically targeted for teens, special classes and mentoring. During the summer of 2018 PALS opened our new play space and soccer field to the children of our community. This project, supported by private donation, The Ahmanson Foundation and Community Development Funding, has helped our program expand and grow. The children are enjoying the play ground, the newly designed basketball court and our new turf field. That fall we enjoyed our first official soccer season. In addition, our PALS programs include after-school tutoring, dance, martial arts instruction, drama, literacy support, art, science classes, sports clinics and competitions, teen leadership, and computer classes. PALS is not only fun, but teaches values like responsibility, citizenship, hard work, respect, and concern for others. The youth center programs also include LAPD Police Cadets and Jr. Cadets for young people interested in police work. Programs at the youth center are open to all youth ages 7 to 17. Along with the daily activities described, PALS offers crime prevention education, field trips, leadership training, camping excursions, and career and college planning assistance. Devonshire PALS sponsors projects involving children and families that develop community pride and participation in the improvement of their neighborhoods. Our core programs are free to all who wish to participate and provides area youth with a wide array of educational, athletic, and recreational activities again, under the mentorship and direct supervision of police officers and local community volunteers. The impact of the Devonshire Youth Center impacts the community by supporting the individuals in our program, individuals who need our help to become all they can be, individuals who need our help to become the community members we hope for.

5) We Serve

Over our 46-year history, Devonshire PALS programs have involved thousands of local youth. In 2018 we served over 121 youth per day with summer attendance reaching an average 147 children per day. We serve 2,500 active members annually while maintaining quality, high impact programs. Providing programming for local kids is our top priority. Many PALS kids attend Patrick Henry Middle School, Kennedy High School, Valley Academy of Arts and Sciences, Tulsa Elementary and

of course, Granada Hills Charter High School. For years we have so proud to partner with GHCHS and the wonderful students who are PALS program influencers and they serve our facility through required service learning. We are proud to say we have hired part time our first PALS kids who came up through our program and recently graduated from GHCHS. Andrew Ortiz, is a born leader, civically minded and plans to study politics. Other recent high school graduates are currently attending Harvard University, UC Berkley, UC San Diego UCLA, CSUN, Brown University, Bucknell University and Pierce College. According to California State Income Standards and our records, 87% of our participants live at the very low income or poverty level. The 2018 members of PALS were counted in the following ethnicity and gender categories.

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The Problem Being Addressed by Devonshire PALS After-School Program

Juvenile crime is down in our neighborhood year after year. The partnership between community service organizations, local non profits and local law enforcement agencies helps to create community policing that is making a difference. Although great progress has been made, violence, drugs, dysfunctional families and crime challenge this community and change happens slowly over time. Our goal is to impact the youngest members of the community and give them new options for dealing with the challenges they face. The young of this neighborhood, like in so many neighborhoods, face the daily struggle of behavior problems, lack of positive role models, stressful home environments, lack of quality leisure activities, and economic deprivation. Some come home after school to empty houses and are in real need for positive attention. Studies show that in the hours immediately after school juvenile crime and mischief increases dramatically. To counteract the negative influences that confront these underserved kids including gangs, crime, and drug use we have created a safe haven for these children and teens where they can develop skills, meet challenges, make good friends, improve their choices and help them discover new ways of looking at their futures. The youth center is a place of learning and growing that is daily filled with laughter, play and busy, meaningful activities as many of the members of your neighborhood council can probably attest. The primary goals of LAPD Devonshire PALS is to develop character in youth, prevent juvenile crime and create safer communities by giving kids a fun place to play and learn. The program is based on the conviction that young people—if they are reached early enough—can develop strong, positive attitudes toward police officers and the law. PALS promotes trust and understanding between young people and police officers by bringing youth under the supervision and constructive influence of dedicated law enforcement professionals. We believe that if a young person respects a police officer in a recreational or educational setting, he or she will likely come to respect the laws that police officers enforce. We all watch the news. We all realize the importance of crime prevention programs for the youngest members of our neighborhoods. Devonshire PALS is committed to forwarding and supporting the prevention goals of local and national law enforcement. We are grateful for the dedication of our assigned police officers and the support we receive from our local community.




