Resolutions:

SIDEWALK REPAIR:

- 1. Resolved that GHNNC oppose the city ordinance that requires that homeowners at the point of sale provide for the repair of the sidewalks on the property to be sold
- 2. Re4solved that the GHNNC oppose the merging of the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment (DONE) into the Community Development Department (CDD).
- Resolved that GHNNC support the Neighborhood and Education Committee of Los Angeles City Council in their development of a process to allow Neighborhood Councils in finding a method to have convenient access to their funds.
- 4. Resolved that GHNNC oppose the proposed ballot imitative that would place a parcel tax to provide funds to support the city's libraries.
- 5. Resolved that GHNNC support the concept that DWP of developing an office of an interim rate payor advocate and that this office be adequately funded
- 6. Resolved that GHNNC recommend to DWP in their redesign of the bills sent to users of DWP to include the following: All base rates and adjustments be identified as separate line items and that a statement be included on the bill which states that failure to pay the identified municipal charges such as sewer and waste fees will not lead to a suspension of delivery of water or power
