- (2) **Picnic in the Park** will require participation of all GHNNC Board; held in fall at Bee Canyon
- (3) Holiday Parade

Recommendation: We develop a master committee calendar and post it on our web site.

Facilitated Discussion of the goals and priorities of the GHNNC for the 2007- 2008 year

Process to establish goals and priorities:

- 1) Unstructured brainstorming where everyone's ideas were listed without discussion
- 2) Each item was clarified, as needed, by the person who suggested it
- 3) Other items were added and clarified
- 4) Items were combined with the permission of the suggestor
- 5) Everyone was instructed to determine how they would place their six votes across the 12 combined items
- 6) A vote was taken. First; of the stakeholder, non-board members. Second, of the board members.
