Anne called meeting to order at 3:30PM

Committee Members present: Wayde Hunter, Bill Hopkins, Ralph Kroy, Bill Lillenberg, Barbara Iversen, Agnes Lewis and Jan Subar. **Absent:** Ray Pollok and Josh Jordahl.

The Committee agreed to invite the representative of the Assyrian American Association of Southern California, Victor Alexandroff, to discuss the relocation first.

15711 San Fernando Mission Boulevard, (Bethany Community Church): Victor Alexandroff from Relocation Committee for the Assyrian American Association of Southern California.

This association currently has a community center in North Hollywood and they have outgrown their current site and are considering purchasing the Bethany Community Church site which is currently vacant. They want to change the Conditional Use Permit (CUP) because the hours of operation permitted are not enough for what they need. The current permit is limited to 9am to 3pm and 6pm to 8pm on Sundays and 7pm to 9:30pm on Tuesdays and Thursdays. They want to change this to operate Friday and Saturday from 7pm to 1:30am and group Boy Scout meetings on Sunday and Board meetings on Thursdays. Additionally, they want to have 35 to 40 special events (weddings and holiday celebrations).

The Committee asked that they use the existing CUP and add the changes that they are proposing and return to us and that they meet with the neighbors. We would be willing to help them outreach by allowing them to use our office to meet with neighbors. We would not make any recommendation until we spoke to the neighbors because they are the people we represent.

The committee decided that we should draft a general letter to explain the sign ordinance.

Planning and Land Use Meetings, Conferences, Educational Opportunities. Discussion and Possible action

Attendees from the PLUM Committee thought that the LABC sustainability conference was not as informative as expected. It was more of a networking political event.

Discussion and consideration of any new or old information available on BFI/Allied/Republic Waste at Sunshine Canyon Landfill.

Los Angeles County Department of Public Works is proposing to send sediment debris to Sunshine Canyon. This is included in the Draft Sediment Management Strategic Plan. The deadline for comment is August 28, 2012. They are proposing to dump 2000 tons a day to Sunshine Canyon.

Committee Member Comment:

There may be some massage parlors within our boundary that offer more than legitimate massage. The thought is that massage parlors are not permitted by the Specific Plan and the City should be informed about this.

Should be keeping be allowed within the residential zones? Proposal to invite the beekeeper that wants this allowed in residential zones to attend our next PLUM meeting to discuss this issue.

Several residents were submitted to code enforcement for weed abatement and there were a few homes that had swarming bees.
